Justification of the rating and outlooks

Long term:

High credit quality. Protection factors are good. However, risk factors are more variable and more significant in times of economic pressure.

Short Term:

There is very high assurance for timely repayment. Liquidity factors are strong and are supported by good protection factors of key elements. Risk factors are very low.

Key performance factors

The rating is based on the following positive factors:

- Good positioning in a highly competitive environment;
- Strategic actions with high positive impact;
- A business increasingly focused on the local market;
- An increasing level of activity;
- Performance indicators on the rise;
- Good financial flexibility;
- Strong support of the main shareholder.

Main rating factors regarded as negative:

- A decline in the overall performance primarily due to the impact of exchange rate losses;
- Financial balance is yet to be recovered;
- Operating cash flow shows a deficit;
- Net cash position is negative and is deteriorating.
